

HALFWAY POINT!



Ah, clothes?



Should I go to the Centenary Ball?



GENERAL

- Study in a group discussion between classmates will make you realise what knowledge areas you are missing and will also save you from depression
- Change your study environment every now and again so you don't feel stir crazy
- Snacks need we say more?

BDS1

- Learn the fundamentals of biochem and physiology, and pay special attention to the cells/tissues related to • ILAs - for example, clinical the mouth! You are studying dentistry, after all
- Needle-stick injury protocol
- Histology/microscopy from resource sessions
- EBD learn the components of PICO
- Tooth morphology (of course)
- Biodental tutorials content
- Perio gingival assessment and the correct technique for probing (hint: illustrations will certainly help!)

BDS3

- Treatment planning, treatment planning, treatment planning
- Oral pathology describing and giving differential diagnoses for lesions
- Radiographs (don't forget about OPGs!)
- Dental materials different types, its properties, longevity, and how this influences clinical decisions
- Endodontic diagnosis give the pulpal status, the periapical status, and the cause

BDS2

- Tooth development dental age from an OPG, anomalies, process
- implications of cleft lip and palate
- Pathogenesis of caries be able to go from a white spot lesion all the way to a spreading infection
- Embryology know branchial arches and focus on anything related to the mouth
- Know phases of treatment planning and restorative steps
- Articulator and facebow all the components, and their purpose and how they work

BDS4

- Treatment planning be sure to address the CC! It's easy to get sidetracked by all the other info
- Pharmacology learn the names of the general medications (generic and branded) and how they affect the oral cavity, especially those which can deliver the triple whammy effect
- Diagnosis testing: be systematic about these - is the problem caused by:
 - Pulpal? Perio? Occlusion latrogenic?
 - (Don't forget to obtain relevant) radiographs)
