
Hello! Congratulations first years on getting into Dentistry and Oral Health!



SPORT Achieve your #NewYearsResolution to get fit.


Rock climbing – develop those rock solid finger rests at Adelaide's Bouldering Club or Beyond Bouldering (Kent Town or Kreswick).

Tennis – North Adelaide has the nicest public tennis courts you will find, located just past the intersection where O'Connell Street becomes Prospect Road. If those are busy you can head down to the Wilderness Tennis Courts in Lefevre Park.

Badminton – Uni SA's Pridham Hall (\$5 fee incl. racquets and plastic shuttlecocks), the Uni Adelaide badminton club (one free trial session after which you'll need a membership, equipment is provided) or the Adelaide Badminton Centre (outside the city but they run 'all you can play' deals for \$10 per person, check their Facebook page).

Basketball – the previously mentioned tennis courts at the end of O'Connell Street also have height-adjustable basketball rings and are perfect if half court is all you need. Or, you can pay a small fee at Uni SA's Pridham Hall on Hindley to ball indoors (\$5 incl. a ball).

BREAD AND BONE

Highly recommend the #1 (classic tomato ad mozzarella), and the #7 (the mushroom one). (These 2 are also vegetarian friendly).


